Area Of Study	Horse Racing Industry		
General Description	This qualification reflects the role of persons who are responsible for organising their own work within known routines. Work responsibilities cover the maintenance and repair of racing tracks, gardens and other facilities as well as the use of tools and machinery.		
	Students will be expected to demonstrate knowledge of the impact of track and environmental conditions on racing animal welfare.		
	Students may be required to handle greyhounds or horses in emergency situations and assist in marshalling prior to racing (depending on the individual's training plan).		
Delivery Venue	This course is conducted at the Harness Racing Training Centre located at the Bendigo Harness Racing Track, Junortoun near Bendigo by flexible delivery.		
Accreditation	This Course / Qualification has TAFE National Recognition.		
Duration Options	This course can generally be completed in 40 weeks full time depending on the competency development of the individual. It is also offered part time or flexible delivery, the duration will depend on the individual rate of achievement of competencies.		
Fees	This course attracts Victorian Government funding. This qualification may also be provided on a fee for service basis.		
Australian Apprenticeship Options	May be offered as a Traineeship		
Prerequisites of Qualifications / Experience	There are no qualification prerequisites required for entry into this course. Units from the Certificate II in Racing Services (Track Maintenance) are included in this qualification.
